





## 1st Volume: Logic


## 3rd Volume: Philosophy of Man

All of our Faith's truths apply to the human soul. Following upon the previous volumes in the series, Philosophy of Man seeks to help the beginner in philosophy understand the maxim of the Greeks: "Know thyself." The study of the soul is of great use in our pursuit of wisdom because knowledge of the soul assists us in every other branch of knowledge—for it is by means of the soul that we know. Therefore, knowing more about the soul will help us better understand each of the things we know. Following the philosophical system of Saint Thomas, Philosophy of Man will guide the student in how to view his soul and to see the order that God has created. Every philosophical and theological error of modernity culminates in a misunderstanding of who the human person

is, how he is made, and what he is made for. In this third volume of The Foundations of Wisdom, understand how the Church explains that the human person is "fearfully and wonderfully made." Deepen your understanding of our very selves, learning how God made us to come to know Him and see His mark in every aspect of creation.

## 4th Volume: Ethics

Constantly under attack in today's day and age, the Church's philosophy of what it means to be human and how to act serves as the logical consequence and culmination of all the truths of her theology and holy religion. Ethics covers the teachings of Aristotle and Saint Thomas Aquinas, showing how living a life according to the Church's perennial philosophy not only is not contrary to reason but also leads to the culmination of what reason was made for: the perfection of the human person, serving as a vehicle for beatitude. In this fourth and final volume of The Foundations of Wisdom, you will understand the Church's teaching that the human person should act according to the light of



natural reason by delving into the teachings of Saint Thomas and seeing how natural reason harmonizes with the ethics of Holy Mother Church. Finally, understand the journey to happiness that God through His Church has provided for us to reach our ultimate end: eternal beatitude by union with God.



FR. SEBASTIAN WALSHE, OPRAEM, a professor of philosophy in the seminary program, brings a wealth of expertise, having completed his studies at Thomas Aquinas College, The Catholic University of America (where he received a license in Philosophy), and the Pontifical University of St. Thomas (the Angelicum) in Rome, where he earned a Masters in Sacred Theology and a Doctorate in Philosophy. His thesis, entitled The Primacy of the Common Good as the Root of Personal Dignity in the Doctrine of St. Thomas Aquinas, reflects his deep scholarly engagement with Catholic philosophy. Additionally, Fr. Sebastian served as a visiting professor in the Philosophy Department at the Angelicum from 2003-2005, further solidifying his credentials in both teaching and academic rigor.
